Plant for Cool Weather Color

Consider the Conebush

Richly colorful and hardy Leucadendron does double duty as an accent in the landscape and in cut arrangements.

Leucadendron 'Safari Sunset' Safari Sunset Conebush

This is a vigorous evergreen shrub growing to 7'-9' tall and 6'-8' wide. Flower bracts start out coloring red in summer and by winter are a deep wine color. In late winter 'Safari Sunset' takes on a yellow coloring in the center of the bracts while still retaining the red on the outer surfaces. This is a tough cultivar that can handle frost alkalinity and clay soils. An excellent candidate for cut foliage harvesting. Prefers full sun and low water once established.

Leucadendron 'Ebony'

Ebony Conebush

Ebony is an evergreen shrub growing to 3-4' tall and 4-6' wide. Unique, black-purple foliage develops burgundy-colored flower

bracts in the late winter to summer. It works great as a color contrast, does well in containers, and cut foliage is excellent for flower arrangements. Requires a well-drained soil, has low water needs once established, and prefers full sun.

Leucadendron 'Safari Goldstrike'

Yellow Conebush

This is an evergreen shrub growing to 5'-6' tall and wide. This vigorous, compact variety is prized for its attractive foliage, developing light-yellow flower bracts in winter and spring. It looks great as a background, and cut foliage is excellent for flower arrangements. Requires a well-drained soil, has low water needs once established, and prefers full sun.

Leucadendron 'Jester'

Sunshine Conebush

Jester is an evergreen shrub to 4'-5' tall and wide. Its attractive, variegated foliage intensifies in color during cooler months of

the year. Useful as an accent or color contrast, and does well in containers. Cut foliage is great for flower arrangements. Requires a well-drained soil, has low water needs once established, and prefers full sun.

Leucadendron 'Crown Jubilee'

Crown Jubilee Leucadendron

Crown Jubilee is a stunning evergreen shrub growing to 4'-6' tall and 3'-4' wide. Lovely red upright stems feature rainbow foliage that changes from green to yellow or red. The stems and beautiful cones look great in a cut floral arrangement. Needs moderate water and prefers full sun.

Grevillea lanigera 'Coastal Gem' Wooly grevillea

'Coastal Gem' is a low spreading evergreen shrub growing to 1' tall and 4'-5' wide. In late winter and early spring, pink and cream spider-like blooms unfurl against dense foliage of gray-green narrow leaves. Looks great in rock garden or groundcover, has low water needs once established, and prefers full sun.


