

Meeting the 20% Urban Water Use Reduction Goal

Monday, March 25, 2019 3:30pm-5:00pm East Bay Municipal Utility District 375 11th Street, 94607

Wondering how the EBMUD community is doing to meet the Water Conservation Act of 2009? California Senate Bill x7-7 requires urban areas to reduce water consumption 20 percent from baseline levels by 2020.

On Monday, March 25, 2019, EBMUD Manager of Water Conservation Richard Harris, will review Senate Bill x7-7 and provide an update on how the state and the EBMUD community are doing to reach the 2020 goal. Richard will also present the next water conservation efforts planned for California and EBMUD outlined in Executive Order B-37-16, Making Water Conservation a California Way of Life.

Richard, a licensed Civil Engineer, joined EBMUD's Water Conservation
Division in 1999 and has been with the
District for 29 years. Richard oversees the development and implementation of
EBMUD's water conservation master plan to support long-term water supply and demand management goals. As a member of the CA Department of Water Resources
Urban Advisory Group, Richard participated in the 20x2020 process and is continuing to work with state agencies on the implementation of the Long-Term Water Conservation Framework.

The meeting will be held at the EBMUD Administration Building at 375 11th Street in Oakland on the second floor. The Administration Building is conveniently located near the Broadway and 12th Street BART station. Please arrive promptly. Light refreshments will be served.

Public transportation is encouraged. If public transportation is not an option, validated parking is available at the Pacific Renaissance Plaza garage on Webster Street. Bring your token to the meeting and EBMUD will validate at the end of the meeting. Please note, there is no parking available in the EBMUD parking garage.

1972 - 34.36"

1940 - 35.05"

1957 - 36.48"

1981 - 36.63"

1982 - 38.17"

Does this come as a surprise? Being a Bay Area Native, I remember 1982 very clearly. I worked outside in a retail plant nursery and every night I'd come home and put my boots by the wall heater hoping they would dry out by morning. Well, they never did for about five months straight. I had the worst case of athlete's foot.... too much information!

It is refreshing to experience and enjoy a good rainy winter with plenty of snow in the Sierras somewhat like those plentiful years listed above. What was interesting researching the rain information was looking through these decades the amounts look so unpredictable.

The dictionary says a drought is a prolonged period of abnormally low rainfall, leading to a shortage of water. Unfortunately for the bay area, it is not just the rainfall shortages; it is the infrastructure, growing population and many other factors that have made the word 'drought' a common noun in our language.

Today, in 2019 the word drought is so common it is even mentioned in an unusually wet winter like this one. The population of the bay area in 1960 was 3,638,939. In 2010, it was 7,150,739. The next census is in 2020, and estimates the population to be over 10,000,000. With more people living in the Bay Area, (the best place on Earth, okay maybe not the best but

close), prices for water and utilities have nowhere to go but up and our outdated infrastructure needs updating to keep up. Moving forward, conservation should replace the word drought and become part of our everyday lives. It is up to all of us in this industry to make water conservation part of the everyday conversation. New and innovative products are being introduced into the green industry market to help conserve this natural resource.

Be proactive about reaching out to your suppliers and ask what is new on the market to help with conservation. Then talk to your customers. Talk about SMART controllers, moisture sensors, new drought tolerant plant introductions, and MWELO requirements, sell a water audit, use slow release fertilizers, and so much more.


