



Sage, center stage

Salvia, commonly known as Sage, is the
largest genus in the mint family and comes
in a wide variety of shapes, sizes, and
colors - from round shrubs to sprawling
groundcovers. Flowers range from deep
blue to hot red to pastel pink. Square stems
and showy flowers that climb stalks set
spectacular floral displays.

Salvia attracts pollinators such as bees and hummingbirds as well as seed-loving goldfinch and quail. Deer, rabbits, and other pests will typically ignore them.

Most are drought tolerant, easy to grow, and serve a multitude of functions in the garden. Tough, fire-wise, adaptable, and versatile, they liven up any landscape, and look equally amazing when planted in mass, on a slope, in borders, as an accent plant, or in patio containers. They love full sun, a well-drained soil, and thrive on neglect, although to encourage more blooms and help them retain their youthful vigor, it is best to prune back in late winter.

Salvia 'Bee's Bliss'

Bee's Bliss Sage is a moderate-low growing evergreen perennial 1-2' tall spreading 6-8' wide. This deer resistant California native features aromatic gray foliage with attractive purple-blue flowers spring to summer, attracting birds, bees, butterflies and hummers. Excellent ground cover for slopes or cascading over rocks. Full sun. Well-drained soil. Low water once established.

Salvia leucantha Danielle's Dream

Pink Mexican Sage or 'Danielle's Dream' is a fast growing shrub to 2-3' tall to 4-6' wide, featuring velvety white blooms with soft, rose pink tips. Blooms year round. Prefers full sun and little water once established.

Salvia 'Dark Dancer'

'Dark Dancer' is a moderate- to fastgrowing perennial with lightly fragrant foliage and raspberry red, two-lipped blooms. It grows to around 3' tall and wide. Likes full to partial sun and little water once established. Looks great in mixed beds and borders or as a hillside planting.

Salvia leucantha 'Santa Barbara'

Santa Barbara Sage is a highly popular fast-growing evergreen perennial with a shrubby, upright growth habit to 2-3' tall x 3-5' wide. Abundant spikes of velvety purple flowers shoot from silver-green foliage. 'Santa Barbara' is great for fresh or dried cut flower arrangements. Prune in late winter to promote a more compact growth habit. Tolerates coastal conditions and a variety of well-drained soil types.

Salvia leucophylla 'Point Sal'

'Point Sal' is a rambling grower to about 2-3' tall x 10-12' wide. Rings of soft purple-pink blooms travel up stalks of silver-green foliage. This low-water plant tolerates coastal conditions well and is great for filling large open areas. Prefers well drained soil and full to partial sun.


Salvia clevelandii 'Allen Chickering'

Allen Chickering Sage is a moderate-growing evergreen shrubby perennial with upright mounding growth habit 4-5' tall and wide. Deer-resistant California native features aromatic gray-green foliage with deep lavender flowers in late spring-summer attracting bees, butterflies and hummers. Plant in full sun with well-draining soil. Prefers some water while getting established. Little summer water. Very low water required once established.


