Natural Ways to Make Your Halloween Pumpkin Last Longer

- 1. Scrape and discard the pumpkin guts. When prepping your pumpkin for carving, be sure to scrape and discard as much of the pulp (aka pumpkin guts) as possible. The cleaner and drier the pumpkin interior, the slower the rotting process.
- 2. Clean with peppermint dish soap.

 Dilute one tablespoon of a natural peppermint oil or dish soap in a quart of water. Pour the mixture into a clean spray bottle and lightly spray the inside of your pumpkin. Peppermint is antifungal and will slow the decomposition process, extending the life of your pumpkin.
- 3. Refrigerate overnight.

If it's still warm outside, consider placing your carved pumpkins in the fridge at night instead of leaving them on the porch. Spray your pumpkins with the peppermint oil or soap-water mixture and wrap each one in a trash bag prior to placing in the fridge. This will rehydrate your pumpkins each night.

Gardening Facts to Ponder

Did you know...

Most deciduous trees can be pruned now? Even though leaves are still on the branches, the tree is transitioning into dormancy. To reduce fall clean up, consider doing some pruning now. Although later pruning may be necessary for shape, eliminating crossing branches and opening up the canopy will give you a good head start. As winter approaches, trees in the Bay Area rarely have to deal with ice cold temperatures and frigid winds. However, preparing for frost and high winds is an important task now.

Did you know...

Evergreens, majestic in stature, can be affected by our winters. Although tough, they are susceptible to the occasional frost, so pruning is best in the spring once the danger of frost is over. However, the occasional snipping to bring some of that wonderful scented foliage into the home during the holidays is just fine. And don't forget the pinecones!

Did you know...

Other plants such as blueberries, Plum Passion Hydrangea, Concord Grapes, Forsythia, and many others provide a burst of color throughout the landscape. Consider incorporating deciduous shrubs into designs for those amazing autumn focal points. Fall bulbs are in great supply this year.

Did you know...

Crocus and Daffodils deter gophers. Surprise your clients this spring by planting some accent bulbs throughout the landscape. Who can resist the fragrance of Hyacinth or Lilly of the Valley? They make great gifts too.

Did you know...

It's time to lower the height of your lawn mower blades. The shorter grass provides more winter light. Also, mulching those grass clippings will become food for earthworms and microbes that will help make your lawn green and healthy.

Did you know...

Keeping the area clean and open underneath Camellias as well as picking up fallen flowers prevents blossom damaging diseases.

Did you know...

Poinsettias need at least 40 days of a strict regimen of light and dark to produce color. As temperatures drop, bring the plants indoors. Provide 13 to 16 hours of complete and uninterrupted darkness daily by covering with a cardboard box. Then, remove the box for 8 hours. Okay, it may be easier just to go buy a new one. But at least you know how to make them color up for the holidays.
