# **Gardening Facts to Ponder**



### Did you know most Citrus and Roses are grafted?

With citrus, many well-known varieties are grafted onto Ponderosa Lemon rootstock. Unfortunately, if not periodically inspected, suckers from this root stock may grow and quickly take over the preferred plant. Football sized lemons with very thick rinds are the result. All varieties of citrus such as oranges, limes, grapefruits, and of course lemons may be on this rootstock. So, seeing a maturing lemon forming on an orange tree may cause some confusion.

"Ponderosa Lemon is a large fruit with a think and bumpy rind. Since both the tree and the fruit resemble citron in most respects, there is little doubt that Ponderosa is a hybrid between citron and lemon. This variety originated about 1887 as a seedling grown by George Bowman of Hagerstown, Maryland, and was named and introduced into the nursery trade in 1900. Ponderosa makes a nice ornamental with its purple-tinged flowers and new growth; however it is sensitive to cold and very thorny." (University of California, Riverside)

As with citrus, most roses are also grafted onto a hardier and more aggressive rootstock. As with the lemon mentioned above,



this method of propagation can cause unwanted suckers that grow quickly and usually are very thorny. In any rose garden, consistent sucker pruning is necessary to keep the rootstock under control. If not, it will quickly over take most rose plants.

# Did you know Halloween dates back more than 2000 years ago?

"Halloween's origins date back to the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain (pronounced sow-in). The Celts, who lived 2,000 years ago in the area that is now Ireland, the United Kingdom, and northern France, celebrated their New Year on November 1. This day marked the end of summer and the harvest and the beginning of the dark, cold winter, a time of year that was often associated with human death. Celts believed that on the night before the New Year, the boundary between the worlds of the living and the dead became blurred. On the night of October 31 they celebrated Samhain, when it was believed that the ghosts of the dead returned to earth." (www.history.com)
